INTRODUCED BILL

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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT CERTAIN
RESIDENTS OF A REFUSE DISPOSAL DISTRICT WILL BE CHARGED A
FEE LESS THAN THAT CHARGED TO OTHER RESIDENTS; AND AMENDING

SECTION 69-6007, R.C.M. 1947."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 69-6007, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to read as follows:

"69-6007. Service fees -- exceptions -- maintenance assessments -- disposal fee. To defray the cost of maintenance and operation of said refuse disposal district, the board, shall establish a fee for service with approval of the county commissioners.

(1) The This fee shall be assessed to all units in the district that are receiving a service for the purpose of maintenance and operation of said district. The fees shall be based upon a family residential unit, and fees for commercial and industrial accounts shall be based on the comparison with a typical residential unit as to volume and type of waste produced. In no case shall the fee for disposal service exceed one half (1/2) the total fee for both collection and disposal services. The month the service

begins the department of revenue or its agents shall insure that the amount of this fee is placed on the tax notices to be collected with the tax.

(2) No more than twenty-five percent (25%) of the fee

charged a family residential unit under subsection (1) shall

be assessed against a residence in which the person or

persons residing are over the age of sixty (60) years or, if

a family of two or more, have a total income of less than

six thousand dollars (\$6,000). Persons qualifying for this

exception shall make an affidavit to the county treasurer

attesting to such qualification on a form provided by the

board.

(3) If a property owner fails to pay this the fee, it shall become a lien upon the property. All fees and other moneys received by the district shall be placed in a separate fund with the county treasurer of such county and shall be used solely for the purpose for which said refuse disposal district was created. Warrants upon such funds shall be drawn by the board of county commissioners upon presentation of claims approved by the board.

(4) Fees and other moneys collected by joint county refuse disposal districts may be administered by one (1) county treasurer's office upon mutual agreement by the county commissioners of any joint refuse disposal district."

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
