D	DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to change the definition of final salary as an average of two years service rather than three in the Highway Patrolmen's Retirement System.

### **ASSUMPTIONS:**

- 1. The actuarial cost as developed by a consulting actuary for changing the final salary definition is one percent of gross salaries.
- 2. Estimated gross salaries for uniformed patrolmen will be \$2.8 million in FY 76 and \$3.0 million in FY 77.

#### **CONCLUSION:**
