BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Identification of traps. All traps for the capture of wild animals shall be clearly marked to identify the owner and to specify his address. A tag shall be attached to each trap to indicate the date of its most recent check. The tag may be designed to change or to add a date at each checking, but it may not be predated in advance of the day of checking.

Section 2. Modification of steel-jaw and leg-hold traps. All traps used for the capture of wild animals shall be designed in such a way as to be as humane as possible within their purpose. Steel-jaw and leg-hold traps shall be wrapped with rubber or a similar substance so that the trap does not crush the bone of the animal or tear through the flesh. The department of fish and game or any agency

l charged with regulating the trapping of wild animals shall

2 promulgate and distribute specifications for the

3 modification of steel-jaw and leg-hold traps and any other

4 trap to conform with this act. The department shall also

5 provide for wide distribution of information concerning live

6 traps and instant-kill traps, and shall pursue actively a

7 program to relieve all animals of unnecessary suffering in

8 traps.

9 Section 3. Regular checking of traps required. It is

10 unlawful for any trap of any description to be left

11 unchecked for longer than forty-eight (48) hours.

12 Section 4. Penalty. A person convicted of violating

13 this act shall be fined fifty dollars (\$50) for each day

14 that he is in violation.
