11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Trustees may enter into contracts and issue 12 ponds for joint construction. The trustees of a school 13 district may enter into a contract with the trustees of any 14school district within the county, or with any school 15 district in an adjoining county, to provide for the joint 16 17 construction of vocational-technical centers upon such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon between such 19 19 districts. The trustees of any district executing a contract in accordance with this act may levy taxes and 20 issue bonds for the purpose of constructing the facilities 21 authorized by this section. 22
