4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROVIDE AN
 5 ALTERNATIVE METHOD OF CODIFYING ORDINANCES; AMENDING SECTION
 6 11-1102, R.C.M. 1947."
 7

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

9 Section 1. Section 11-1102, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to
 10 read as follows:

11 "11-1102. Ordinances--how prepared. (1) All
 12 ordinances, bylaws and resolutions must be passed by the
 13 council and approved by the mayor, or the person acting in
 14 his stead, and must be recorded in a book kept by the clerk
 15 called "The Ordinance Book," and numbered in the order in
 16 which they are passed or codified by numerical decimal
 17 system.

18 (2) The governing body of an incorporated city or town
 19 may adopt technical building, zoning, health, electrical,
 20 fire, and plumbing codes in whole or in part by reference.
 21 At least fifteen (15) days prior to final action by a
 22 governing body of the city or town, notice of intent to
 23 adopt a technical code in whole or in part by reference
 24 shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in
 25 the city or town and three (3) copies of the code, or part

1 to be adopted, shall be filed with the clerk of the city or
 2 town for inspection by the public.

3 (3) If a technical code, or part of a code, is adopted
 4 by reference, a record in "The Ordinance Book" may be made
 5 by recording the ordinance without setting forth the
 6 provisions of the code, or part of a code, adopted.

7 (4) Ordinances take effect from and after their
 8 passage, except as otherwise ordered, and no ordinance shall
 9 be passed containing more than one subject, which shall be
 10 clearly expressed in its title, except ordinances for the
 11 codification and revision of ordinances."
