 16 provided in section 93-1904, provided, however, that all
 17 transcripts and bills of exceptions required by the county
 18 shall be furnished without cost, payable in monthly
 19 installments out of the general funds of the counties
 20 comprising the district for which he is appointed, according
 21 and in proportion to the number of civil and criminal
 22 actions entered and commenced in the district courts of such
 23 counties respectively in the preceding year; and it shall be
 24 the duty of the judge of such district, on the first day of
 25 January of each year, or as soon thereafter as may be. to

1 apportion the amount of such salary to be paid by each
 2 county in his district on the basis aforesaid. The reporter
 3 is allowed, in addition to the salary and fees above
 4 provided, in judicial districts comprising more than one (1)
 5 county, his actual and necessary expenses of transportation
 6 and living when he goes on official business to a county of
 7 his judicial district other than the county in which he
 8 resides, from the time he leaves his place of residence
 9 until he returns thereto, said expenses to be apportioned
 10 and payable in the same way as the salary."

read as follows:

"93-1906. Salary and expenses of reporter--
apportionment. Every reporter appointed under the provisions
of this chapter receives is entitled to receive an annual
salary of not less than twelve thousand five hundred
dollars (\$12,500) SAID SALARY TO BE SET BY THE JUDGE IN THE
DISTRICT IN WHICH THE REPORTER WORKS, and no other
compensation except as provided in section 93-1904,
provided, however, that all transcripts and bills of
exceptions required by the county shall be furnished without
cost, payable in monthly installments out of the general
funds of the counties comprising the district for which he
is appointed, according and in proportion to the number of
civil and criminal actions entered and commenced in the

district courts of such counties respectively in the
preceding year; and it shall be the duty of the judge of
such district, on the first day of January of each year, or
as soon thereafter as may be, to apportion the amount of
such salary to be paid by each county in his district on the
basis aforesaid. The reporter is allowed, in addition to the
salary and fees above provided, in judicial districts
comprising more than one (1) county, his actual and
necessary expenses of transportation and living when he goes
on official business to a county of his judicial district
