"92-703.1. Compensation for injuries causing partial disability. (1) Weekly compensation benefits for injury producing partial disability shall be sixty-six and two-thirds percent (66 2/3%) of the difference between the wages received at the time of the injury and the wages that the injured employee is capable of earning thereafter, subject to a maximum weekly compensation of sixty-dellars (\$69)-a-week τ one half (1/2) the state's average weekly wage.

(2) The compensation shall be paid during the period of disability, not exceeding however, five hundred (500) weeks in cases of partial disability; provided, however, that compensation for partial disability resulting from the

- greater number of weeks than is specified in section 92-709

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to change the maximum weekly Workmen's Compensation benefits for partial disability from \$60 per week to one-half the state's average weekly wage.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Workmen's Compensation payments for partial disability will be made from the Workmen's Compensation Division Agency Fund which is supported by insurance premiums.
- 2. Increasing the maximum weekly benefit would increase yearly payments which in turn will require an increase in insurance carrier's premium rates paid by employers.
- 3. The extent of the rquired premium rate increase can only be determined by using actuarial evaluations. An actuarial evaluation cannot be conducted within the time allowed for a fiscal note.

CONCLUSION:

Enactment of House Bill 362 will not increase General Fund expenditures. It will increase compensation payments from the Workmen's Compensation Agency Fund and thus necessitate increased employer paid insurance premiums.
