DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION: House Bill 381 allows high school districts to increase regular average number belonging (ANB) for students who complete graduation requirements in less than eight semesters or equivalent amount of secondary school enrollment.	

## ASSUMPTION:

Presently high school students eligible for early graduation are compelled to stay in school for the entire year. Thus, one average number belonging is currently being granted for each such student.

## CONCLUSION:

Enactment of House Bill 381 will not affect state or local government revenues or expenditures since it will not after the current level of ANB.
