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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 11 Section 1. Section 69-6901, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to 12 13 read as follows:

The state of Montana, 14 recognizing the complexity and gravity of decisions 15 associated with medical-termination-of pregnancy, declares 16 it the policy of the state to provide for the accessibility 17 of approved qualified counseling services for any female 18 resident of Montana who may-request-medical-termination-of 19 her-pregnancy demonstrates a need for problem pregnancy 20 counseling. The policy stated in this act shall be a 21 22 minimum standard for abortion counseling services and is not 23 intended to limit the availability."
