- The board shall, when any person applies for 8 of an operator's or chauffeur's license or 9 motorcycle endorsement, test the applicant's eyesight, knowledge of traffic laws of this state, ability to read and 10 11 understand highway signs, regulating, warning and directing traffic and general knowledge of safe driving practices, and 12 13 may also, in the board's discretion, have such applicant 14 demonstrate his physical ability to operate and to exercise ordinary and reasonable care in the operation of a motor 15 vehicle. A person shall be deemed to have applied for 16 17 renewal of a Montana operator's or chauffeur's license if
