DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 470 revises the requirements for qualifications of persons of Indian blood for fee waivers and includes all post-secondary schools. The state is required to reimburse the respective institutions for the amount of fees waived.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Fees which can be waived at universities average \$100 per quarter or \$300 per year. Fees at vocational technical schools average approximately \$200 per year.
- 2. Approximately 500 more persons per year would qualify for fee waivers at universities. Assume all who are newly eligible would request fee waivers.
- 3. An estimated 15% of vocational technical students would qualify for fee waivers, or 580 in FY 76 and 640 in FY 77.

FISCAL IMPACT:	FY 76	FY 77
Decrease in university fee collections	\$ 150,000	\$ 150,000
Decrease in vocational technical fee collections	116,000	128,000
Total decrease in fee collections	\$ 266,000	\$ 278,000

Decrease in fee collections are to be reimbursed by the State. Thus, additional state expenditures under House Bill 470 would equal the decrease in fee collections of \$266,000 in FY 76 and \$278,000 in FY 77.

CONCLUSION:

Enectment of House Bill 470 would result in an increase in State General Fund expenditures of approximately \$544,000 during the biennium. Fee reimbursements to the units of post-secondary education are to be used for scholarships under House Bill 470. Therefore, even though the units will be reimbursed for their loss in fees, there will be a decrease in funds available for operating expenses of \$300,000 for the universities and \$244,000 for the vocational technical schools.
