Zouse BILL NO. 476 INTRODUCED BY -A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR NONPAYMENT OF FEES FOR PERSONS OF MEXICAN-AMERICAN DESCENT FOR ENROLLMENT IN THE STATE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM." BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: Section 1. Mexican-Americans -- nonpayment of fees. A person may enroll in a school, college or university of the 11 Montana system of post-secondary education without payment 12 of fees when these requirements are met: 13 (1) the person is of one-half (1/2) Mexican-American 14 descent; and 15 (2) the person has been a bona fide resident of the 16 state of Montana for at least one (1) year prior to enrollment; and 18 (3) the person has completed either a four (4) year 19 course of 20 (a) an accredited high school, or 21 (b) its equivalent. 22 Rules governing the selection of eligible persons shall 23 be made by the several units of the university system. 24 When fee waivers are granted, the state of Montana 25 shall reimburse the respective institutions an amount equal

# FISCAL NOTE

In compliance with a written request received <u>February 3</u>, 19 <u>75</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>House Bill 476</u> pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 476 provides for waiver of fees for enrollment in the state University System for persons of Mexican-American descent and provides for state reimbursement to the universities.

### ASSUMPTIONS:

1. The 1970 U.S. Census of Population indicates there are 4022 persons of Spanish language 18 years of age or older living in the State of Montana. It is not possible to predict the portion of the 4,022 persons who would be eligible for waiver of fees.

2. The University System fees which are waivable are \$100 per quarter or \$300 yearly.

### CONCLUSIONS:

The lack of data availability precludes any definitive prediction of the fiscal impact of House Bill 476.
