1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
12	Section 1. Section 26-1808, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to

۱6	(1) Any person who violates the provisions of this act or

L9	(2) Upon a first conviction for a violation under this
20	chapter, the court may fine the defendant not to exceed two
21	hundred fifty dollars (\$250). Upon a second such
22	conviction, the defendant may be fined not to exceed five
23	hundred dollars (\$500) or be imprisoned in the county jail
24	for any term not to exceed six-(6)-menths THIRTY (30) DAYS,
25	or both. Upon subsequent such convictions, the defendant

1	shall be fined not less than five hundred dollars (\$500) on
2	more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000), and in addition may
3	be imprisoned in the county jail for any term not to exceed

7	(2)(3) Any officer employed and authorized by the
8	director or any peace officer of the state or of any
9	municipality or county within the state shall have authority

11	(3)(4) Wildlife seized under the provisions of this
12	act shall be held by an officer or agent of the department
13	pending disposition of court proceedings, and thereafter be
14	forfeited to the state for disposition as the director may
15	deem appropriate; provided, that, prior to forfeiture, the
16	director may direct the transfer of wildlife so seized to a
17	qualified zoological, educational, or scientific institution
18	for safekeeping. The commission is authorized to issue
19	regulations to implement this subsection."
