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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT RELATING TO THE SCHOOL FOUNDATION PROGRAM; PROVIDING FOR CHANGES IN FINANCIAL SCHEDULES FOR THE MAXIMUM GENERAL FUND BUDGETS FOR ELEMENTARY AND HIGH SCHOOLS; AMENDING SECTION 75-6905, R.C.M. 1947."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
Section 1. Section 75-6905, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to read as follows:
"75-6905. Maximum - general - fund - budget - without - a - voted - levy schedules for elementary anā high schools. The total amount of the general fund budget of any district shall not be greater than the general fund budget amount specified in the following schedules, except when a district has adopted an emercercy general fund budget under the frovisions of section $75-6727$ or when a district has voted an aciditional levy under the provisions of section 75-6923.

Elementary school Schedule for 1973-74 1975-76
(1) For each elementary school having an Alle of nine (9) or fewer pupils, the maximum shall be seven-thergane

thousand seven hundred fifty dollars (\$9,750), if said school is approved as an isolated school.
(2) For schools with an ANB of ten (10) pupils, but less than eighteen (13) pupils, the maximum shall be seven

(10) For each elementary school having an ANB of nine (9) or fewer pupils, the maximum shall be eight-khersand-one
 thousand seven hundred fifty dollars ( $\$ 9,750$ ), if said school is approved as an isolated school.
(11) For schools with an ANB of ten (10) pupils, but less than eighteen (18) pupils, the maximum shall be eight

(18) The maximum per pupil for all pupils (ANB) and for
all high schools shall be computed on the basis of the amount allowed herein on account of the last eligible pupil, ANB. All high schools and junior high schools which have been approved and accreaited as junior high schools, operated within the incorporated limits of a city or town shall be treated as one (1) school for the purpose of this schedule.
(19) The general fund budget amount for an approved and accredited junior high school shall be prorated between the elementary district general func budget and the high school district general fund budget in the following manner:
(a) determine the per-ANB schedule amount for the school, as defined by this section, from the high school schedule;
(b) calculate the ANB for the regularly enrolled full-time pupils enrolled in the seventh (7th) and eighth (Sth) grades of the junior high school;
(c) multiply the per-ANB schedule amount determined in subsection (a) by the ANB calculated in subsection (b) to determine the authorized general fund budget amount which shall be available for the elementary district general fund buāget; ana
(a) subtract the anount determined in subsection (c) from the total authorized general fund bugget amount for the school to determine the authorized general fund budget
amount which shall be available for the high school district general fund budget.

The general fund budget amount determined for each school of a district under the schedules provided in this section shall be totaled to determine the maximum - general - Eunci - budget - without - a - voted - levy for such district.
(20) For the purpose of establishing the maximum budget without a vote amount for current year special education program for a school district, the superintendent of public instruction will determine the total estimated cost of the special education program for the school district on the basis of a special education program budget submitted by the district. The budget will be prepared on forms provided by the superintendent of public instruction and will set out for each program
(a) the estimated allowable costs associated with operating the program where allowable costs are as defined in section 75-7813.1;
(b) the number of pupils expected to be enrolled in the program; and
(c) any other data required by the superintendent of public instruction for budget justification purposes and to administer the provisions of this act. The total amount of allowable costs approved by the superintendent of public -11-
instruction shall the special education maximu-budget-without-a-vote amount for current year special education program purposes. The total amount of allowable costs that are approved for the special education budget shall not, under any condition, be less than the maximum-buaget-without-a-vote amount for one regular ANB for each special full-time pupil in the school district.
(21) If a special education program is implemented or expanded during a given school tem too late to be included in the determination of the district maximum - budget without - a - vote for the school year as prescribed in this chapter, then subject to the approval of the program by the superintendent, under the emergency budget provisions of section 75-6723(5), allowable costs approved under the budgeting provisions of section 75-6905(20) for the operation of the program during the given year may be added to the maximum - budget - without - a - vote amount for special education for the subsequent school year. Such costs must be recorded as "previous year special education expenses" in the school district budget for the subsequent school year.
(22) The sum of the previous year special education expenses as defined in subsection (21) above, and the maximum - budget - without - a - vote for current year special education as defined in subsection (20) shall be the -12-

1 special education budget for accounting purposes.
The maximum - budget - without - a - vote for special education will be added to the maximum - budget - without a - vote of the regular program ANB defined in sections 75-6902 and 75-6903 to obtain the total maximum - budget without - a - vote for the district."

## LOCAL IMPACT:

If House Bill 529 is enacted, the local requirement for permissive levy funding will not be significantly affected, except in a few wealthy districts, because all but the wealthiest districts now levy the full 9 mills for elementary school support, and 6 mills for high school support. However, the increases in foundation program and permissive levy amounts represent funding that would otherwise have to be sought at the local level through voted levies on local property.

## CONCLUSIONS:

State Impact. If House Bill 529 is enacted, the amount of general fund support required to fully fund the foundation program will be increased by $\$ 47.34$ million during the $1975-77$ biennium. The statewide property tax levy required to fund the state share of the permissive levy in FY76 will be 12.54 mills, an increase of 3.98 mills over the levy required under the existing law, and in FY77 will be 12.86 mills, an increase of 5.15 mills over the levy required under existing law.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to increase the maximum-General-Fund-budget-without-a-voted-levy schedules for elementary and high schools.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

1. The average number belonging (ANB) will remain at the same level as in FY75.
2. Special education cost will remain at current level.
3. The state's taxable valuation will increase at a rate of $6 \%$ per year.
4. Local permissive levies will raise $\$ 16.35$ million in FY76 and $\$ 17.36$ million in FY77.
5. The statewide total General Fund budgets are projected to be $\$ 189.75$ million for FY76 and $\$ 202.40$ million for FY77.
