 - (b) waive at their discretion, nonresident tuition for selected and approved nonresident students not to exceed at any unit two per cent (2%) of the full-time equivalent enrollment at that unit during the preceding year; except that when necessary such tuition may be waived in excess of two per cent (2%) of unit enrollment for nonresident students who enroll under provisions of any NICHE sponsored state reciprocal agreements which provide for the payment,

where required, of the student support fee by the reciprocal

l state.
