4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS  
 5 69-6806 AND 69-6807, R.C.M. 1947; TO PROVIDE FOR A  
 6 FEASIBILITY STUDY TO DETERMINE RESOURCE RECOVERY VALUE IN  
 7 SOLID WASTE; AND TO PROVIDE THAT THE MOTOR VEHICLE TITLE  
 8 TRANSFER FEE BE CHANGED FROM FOUR DOLLARS TO TWO DOLLARS;  
 9 AND THAT THE FEE FOR REREGISTERING FOR LICENSING OF A MOTOR  
 10 VEHICLE BE CHANGED FROM ONE DOLLAR TO FIFTY CENTS; AND TO  
 11 CHANGE THE FORMULA FOR PAYMENT TO COUNTIES BY ALLOWING THE  
 12 DEPARTMENT TO FUND UP TO FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR THOSE  
 13 COUNTIES THAT HAVE FEWER THAN FIVE THOUSAND MOTOR VEHICLES  
 14 REGISTERED IN THAT COUNTY."

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 16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

17 Section 1. Section 69-6806, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to  
 18 read as follows:

19 "69-6806. Crushing and recycling of junk vehicles. (1)  
 20 The department shall contract for final disposition of junk  
 21 vehicles accumulated in motor vehicle graveyards and shall  
 22 provide for crushing and recycling the material from the  
 23 vehicles.

24 (2) The department may also contract to dispose of, by  
 25 crushing and recycling, junk vehicles accumulated in the

1 yard of a motor vehicle wrecking facility. The department  
 2 may so contract only upon the request of the facility and  
 3 only if there is an accumulation of at least two hundred  
 4 (200) vehicles at the facility.

5 (3) All moneys received from the sale of the junk  
 6 vehicles or from recycling of the material shall be  
 7 deposited with the state treasurer to be utilized for: ~~the~~  
 8 ~~control, collection, and disposal of junk vehicles.~~

9 (a) control, collection, and disposal of junk  
 10 vehicles; and

11 (b) to conduct a feasibility study to determine the

8 (2) There is assessed a special junk vehicle disposal  
9 fee commencing on July 1, 1973, on each new application for

21 (a) vehicles leased or owned by the state or by a  
22 county or municipality;

23 (b) vehicles used for transportation by nonresident,  
24 migratory workers temporarily employed in agricultural work  
25 in this state;

1 (c) vehicles displaying dealers' license plates, as  
2 provided in section 53-122, while owned by a dealer;

3 (d) house trailers or equipment which are not  
4 self-propelled or which require towing upon a highway of  
5 this state.

6 (3) The department shall report to each legislature  
7 the amount collected under this act and the cost of  
8 administration of the act to date so that any necessary  
9 adjustment of the amount of the fee may be made to assure  
10 that no more than the actual cost of operation of the  
11 program is collected.

12 (4) The department shall pay to a county the amount of  
13 the approved budget of the county. ~~However,--the~~ The yearly  
14 payment may not exceed one dollar (\$1) for each motor  
15 vehicle under 8001 pounds GVW that is licensed in that  
16 county. However, for those counties that have fewer than  
17 five thousand (5,000) such motor vehicles, the department  
18 may pay up to five thousand dollars (\$5,000), providing the  
19 county can justify this payment."

HOUSE BILL NO. 557

INTRODUCED BY DRISCOLL, MELOY

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 69-6806 AND 69-6807, R.C.M. 1947; TO PROVIDE FOR A FEASIBILITY STUDY TO DETERMINE RESOURCE RECOVERY VALUE IN SOLID WASTE; AND TO PROVIDE THAT THE MOTOR VEHICLE TITLE TRANSFER FEE BE CHANGED FROM FOUR DOLLARS TO TWO DOLLARS; AND THAT THE FEE FOR REREGISTERING FOR LICENSING OF A MOTOR VEHICLE BE CHANGED FROM ONE DOLLAR TO FIFTY CENTS; AND TO CHANGE THE FORMULA FOR PAYMENT TO COUNTIES BY ALLOWING THE DEPARTMENT TO FUND UP TO FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR THOSE COUNTIES THAT HAVE FEWER THAN FIVE THOUSAND MOTOR VEHICLES REGISTERED IN THAT COUNTY."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 69-6806, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to read as follows:

"69-6806. Crushing and recycling of junk vehicles. (1) The department shall contract for final disposition of junk vehicles accumulated in motor vehicle graveyards and shall provide for crushing and recycling the material from the vehicles.

(2) The department may also contract to dispose of, by crushing and recycling, junk vehicles accumulated in the

yard of a motor vehicle wrecking facility. The department may so contract only upon the request of the facility and only if there is an accumulation of at least two hundred (200) vehicles at the facility.

(3) All moneys received from the sale of the junk vehicles or from recycling of the material shall be deposited with the state treasurer to be utilized for: ~~the control, collection, and disposal of junk vehicles;~~

(a) control, collection, and disposal of junk vehicles; and

(b) to conduct a feasibility study to determine the suitability of resource recovery from our solid waste, the cost of which may not exceed two hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000), AND THE RESULTS OF WHICH WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC AND LEGISLATURE BY 1977.

(4) Any individual may dispose of a junk vehicle by delivering the vehicle to a motor vehicle graveyard and by delivering to the department the certificate or evidence of title to the vehicle, or a written release of the vehicle."

Section 2. Section 69-6807, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to read as follows:

"69-6807. Deposit of fees -- special junk vehicle assessment fee. (1) All motor vehicle wrecking facility license fees and fees collected as motor vehicle disposal fees shall be deposited with the state treasurer to be
