"75-7701. Definitions. As used in this Title chapter,
unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

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"Vocational education" means the instruction and training to prepare or improve the pupil student for gainful employment that does not require a baccalaureate or higher degree. This definition of vocational education shall include guidance and prevocational, related or technical instruction necessary to prepare the pupil student for further vocational education or for entry into employment.

19 "Post-secondary Postsecondary vocational-technical 20 education" means vocational-technical---education---of 21 post-secondary-vocational-technical-pupils-which instruction and training that is conducted by a gost-secondary 22 23 postsecondary vocational-technical center or through other 24 programs as desginated by the board of vocational education.

25 Post-secondary Postsecondary vocational-technical education

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shall include the 13th and 14th year and beyond but will not include work toward a baccalaureate degree.

"Post-secondary Postsecondary vocational-technical pupil student" means a person who has completed or left school, is at least sixteen (16) years of age, and is available for study in preparation for entering the labor market, for re-entering the labor market, or for employment stability or advancement in employment.

"Post-secondary Postsecondary vocational-technical center" means a state school used principally for the provision of post-secondary postsecondary vocational-technical education to persons who qualify as post-secondary postsecondary vocational-technical pupils students. These centers are designated by the state board of vocational education as defined in section 75-7702 upon direction by the legislature. All other public or private schools are hereby prohibited from using this title."

18 Section 5. Section 75-7704, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to read as follows:

20 "75-7704. District authorization to establish and
21 maintain vocational education courses and programs. The
22 trustees of any district, community college district, or
23 unit of the Montana university system may establish and
24 maintain a vocational education course or program that
25 complies with the vocational education standards adopted by

the <u>state</u> board of <u>vocational</u> education <u>as defined in</u>

<u>section 75-7702</u>. In order for a course or program to be

eligible for state or federal financing, it shall be

The treasurer of the state of Montana is hereby designated as the custodian of all federal and state moneys designated, appropriated or apportioned for vocational education. All moneys received from any federal or state source for the establishment, operation or furtherance of vocational education in the state shall be deposited with the state treasurer. At the direction of the state board of vocational education as defined in section 75-7702, he shall dispurse all moneys appropriated or received for vocational education."

18 Section 7. Section 75-7707, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to read as follows:

"75-7707. Post-secondary Postsecondary vocational-technical center designation. Post-secondary vocational-technical centers shall be designated by the state board of vocational education as defined in section 75-7702 only upon direction of the legislature. Applications for designation must be made in accordance with the

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following procedure:

(1) The trustees of any night school district, of a county high school, of a community college district, or the governing board of any unit of the Montana university system may submit an application for designation of a post-secondary postsecondary vocational-technical center to be operated by such trustees or governing board. The application for designation shall be submitted in accordance with the time, data and form requirements prescribed by the board of education. Applicant high school districts, county high schools, or community college districts shall be located in a county with a taxable valuation of at least forty-five million dollars (\$45,000,000).

superintendent-of-public-instruction-acting-in-his-capacity
as--the executive officer for vocational education of-the
board-of-education. The superintendent-of-public-instruction
executive officer shall review the application and present
it to the administrative committee of the state board of
vocational education along with his recommendations. The
board--of--education administrative committee shall then
examine the application and recommendations of the
superintendent--of--public-instruction executive officer and
either adopt the recommendations of the--superintendent--ofpublic--instruction or draft its own recommendations. The

application, together with all recommendations shall be presented by the <u>state</u> board of <u>vocational</u> education to the next following <u>legislative-assembly</u> legislature.

The state board of vocational education shall recognize
the presently designated post-secondary postsecondary
vocational-technical centers operated by the respective
board of trustees of school district number 1 of Silver Bow
County, high school district number 1 of Lewis and Clark
County, high school district "A" of Cascade County, Missoula
County high school, and high school district number 2 of
Yellowstone County."

12 Section 8. Section 75-7708, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to read as follows:

\*75-7708. Program and budget categories for post-secondary postsecondary vocational-technical education centers. The state board of vocational education as defined in section 75-7702 shall have the sole authority for the approval of the post-secondary postsecondary vocational-technical education programs and their budgets. Such programs and budgets shall be placed into three categories defined as:

(1) Maintenance and operation. The maintenance and operation category shall include programs and costs for instruction; vocational guidance and counseling; job placement; travel of pupils students and personnel while

engaged in a program; acquisition, maintenance, and repair of equipment; and the rental of necessary emergency facilities for not more than one year.

- (2) Construction. The construction category shall include the program and cost for construction of new buildings; acquisition, expansion, remodeling and alteration of existing buildings; site acquisition and improvements; architectural fees; and the purchase of initial equipment.
- (3) Ancillary services. The ancillary services category shall include the program and cost for the services and activities necessary to assure quality in the post-secondary postsecondary vocational-technical center's instruction, such as supervision and administration of the center, program evaluation, special demonstration and experimental programs, and development of instructional materials and curriculum.

The trustees of the designated district or other governing board where the post-secondary postsecondary vocational-technical center is located shall submit program proposals and the related budgets on the basis of these categories and in accordance with the program and budget approval procedure prescribed by the state board of vocational education.

Section 9. Section 75-7709, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to read as follows:

postsecondary vocational-technical center budgets -- state
board of public vocational education administration. The
total of the budgets approved by the state board of public
vocational education as defined in section 75-7702 together
with the budget for the cost of state administration of the
post-secondary postsecondary vocational-technical centers
shall constitute the total maximum approved, state-wide
budget which shall be financed as follows:

- (1) The primary source of financing is to be those funds specifically designated by legislative enactment or referendum by the people for financing post-secondary postsecondary vocational-technical education in Montana.
- (2) The board of county commissioners of each county in which a designated post-secondary postsecondary vocational-technical center is located is hereby authorized to levy a tax of not to exceed one (1) mill on the dollar of all taxable property, real and personal, within the county for the support and maintenance of the post-secondary postsecondary vocational-technical center located within the said county.
- 22 (3) Designated post-secondary postsecondary
  23 vocational-technical centers shall be eligible to receive
  24 such funds from the federal government as the state board of
  25 public vocational education may provide pursuant to

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applicable Acts of Congress.

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- (4) The board of trustees of any designated high school district, or county high school district where a post-secondary postsecondary vocational center is located may be required, as a condition for the construction in such district of a post-secondary postsecondary vocational center, or any part thereof, to furnish up to fifty percent (50%) of the amount of funds required for any such construction. The percentage of construction funds to be furnished by such designated district shall be derived, in whole or in part, from any of the following sources:
- 12 (a) The sale of bonds issued by such district. Such
  13 bonds shall be issued in conformity with the requirements of
  14 chapter 71 of Title 75 in the case of high school and county
  15 high school district.
- 16 (b) Any other funds available to such district which
  17 may be legally and properly applied toward such
  18 construction.
  - (c) The reasonable value of land, buildings, fixtures or equipment furnished by such district, subject to the approval of the <u>state</u> board of <u>public</u> <u>vocational</u> education.
- 22 (5) If the aggregate financing provided by sources of 23 revenue in (1), (2) and (3) does not provide one hundred per 24 cent (100%) financing of the maximum approved, state-wide 25 budget, the remaining deficiency shall be financed from any

appropriated by the legislature 1 state funds for post-secondary postsecondary vocational-technical education. 2 The state board of public vocational education shall 3 direct the distribution of the funds specified in 4 subsections (1), (3), and (5) of this section on the basis 5 of the budgets approved by the state board of sublice vocational education. The funds earned by the mill levy specified in subsection (2) of this section shall be credited by the county treasurer to the post-secondary 10 postsecondary vocational-technical center fund,

The state board of public vocational education shall determine the amount of financing available from these five sources of revenue and may approve budgets for maintenance and operation, construction and ancillary services. The aggregate amount of the budgets so approved by the state board of public vocational education for post-secondary postsecondary vocational-technical centers shall not exceed the moneys determined to be available."

Any balance in the account in which such moneys are maintained shall not lapse at any time, but shall be continuously available to the superintendent of public instruction for expenditures consistent with this act and acts of the federal government.

The governor and the executive officer for vocational education are authorized on behalf of the state of Montana to request and accept moneys for vocational

education as are now or will be made available under any act of Congress of the United States, or otherwise, for purposes of building construction for vocational education or for any other purpose for vocational education as permitted under the laws of the state of Montana and as authorized by the grants from the federal government.

Such moneys shall be deposited by the governor and the executive officer for vocational education in the state treasury, and are appropriated and made available to the executive officer for vocational education.
