The legislature finds 16 and declares that technological and economic changes of 17 state, national and international magnitude can produce and have produced adverse economic and environmental effects of 18 19 significance for the state of Montana; that the Montana and 20 national economies are in a period of crisis; that 21 significant segments of the Montana public are burdened or 22 imperiled by this crisis: that substantial changes in the 23 structure and functioning of the economy may be at hand due 24 to this crisis; that these changes should be viewed as 25 opportunities for beneficial change and should be aided by
