Definitions. As used in this act: 11 (1) "Alcoholic beverages" means any liquid suitable 12 for drinking by human beings, that contains one-half of one 13 percent (1/2 of 1%) or more of alcohol by volume. (2) "Highway" means the entire width between the 14 15 boundary lines of every way publicly maintained when any part thereof is open to the use of the public for purposes 16 17 of vehicular travel. (3) "Motor vehicle" includes every vehicle that is 18 self-propelled and every vehicle that is propelled by 19 electric power obtained from overhead trolley wires, but not 20 21 operated upon rails. Section 2. Open container law -- penalty. (1) No 22 23 person may drink or consume alcoholic beverages in or on any motor vehicle when that vehicle is upon a public highway. 24

No person may have in his possession on his person while in

or on a private motor vehicle upon a public highway, any bottle or receptacle containing alcoholic beverages that has been opened, the seal broken, or the contents of which have been partially removed. It is unlawful for the owner of a private motor vehicle or the driver, if the owner be not then present in or on the motor vehicle, to keep or allow to be kept in a motor vehicle, when that vehicle is upon the public highway, any bottle or receptacle containing alcoholic beverages that has been opened, the seal broken. 10 or the contents of which have been partially removed except 11 when the bottle or receptacle is kept in the trunk of the 12 motor vehicle when the vehicle is equipped with a trunk, or 1.3 kept in some other area of the vehicle not normally occupied 14 by the driver or passengers, if the motor vehicle is not 15 equipped with a trunk. A utility compartment or glove 16 compartment is within the area occupied by the driver and 17 passengers. In self-propelled motor homes, bottles or receptacles may be kept in storage areas that are more than 18 19 five (5) feet from the driver's seat. 20 (2) A person violating the provisions of this section

is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be

fined not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25) or more than

one hundred dollars (\$100). The highway patrol bureau shall

not record the violation against the driving record of such
