DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to revise the per diem allowance for travel outside the state by state employees from \$25 per day for meals and lodging to \$12 per day for meals plus reasonable actual expenditure for lodging.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. Approximately 19,425 man days will be spent in out-of-state travel in FY 76; 20,350 man days in FY 77.

2. The average cost for lodging in major out-of-state cities is \$20 per night per person.

FISCAL IMPACT:	FY 76	FY 77
Expenditure under current law	\$485,625	\$508,750
Expenditure under proposed law	621,600	651,200
Increase in expenditure	<u>\$135,975</u>	<u>\$142,450</u>

CONCLUSION:

Enactment of Senate Bill 8 would increase expenditures by approximately \$278,500 for the biennium.
