A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROMOTE THE EFFECTIVE MANAGEMENT OF THE BOBCAT AS A NON-GAME ANIMAL; AMENDING SECTIONS 26-201, 46-1902, AND 46-1903, R.C.M. 1947.* . 7

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10 Section 1. Section 26-201, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to 11 read as follows:

"26-201. Definitions. For the purposes of this act, 12 13 the following shall be construed, respectively to mean:

Commission. The state fish and game commission. 14

15 Person. The plural or singular, male or female, as the demands. 16 case including individual. associations. partnerships, and corporations, unless the context otherwise 17 requires. 18

Open season. The time during which game birds, fish, 19 game and fur-bearing animals may be lawfully taken. 20

21 Closed season. The time during which game birds, fish, 22 game and fur-bearing animals may not be lawfully taken.

Angling or fishing. The taking of, or attempting to 23 take fish by hook and single line or single rod in hand or 24 25 within immediate control.

1 Upland game birds. Sharptail grouse, blue grouse, prairie chicken, sage hen or sage grouse, fool hen, ruffed grouse, commonly called native pheasant or native partridge. quail, Chinese pheasant and Mongolian pheasant, commonly 5 called ring-necked pheasant, Hungarian partridge, ptarmigan,

7 Migratory game birds. Waterfowl, including wild ducks, wild geese, brant, and swans; cranes, including little brown, sandhill and whooping cranes; rails, including coots,

10 callinules, sora or other rails; shore birds, including

11 avocets, curlew, dowitcher, godwits, knots, upland plover,

12 kill-deer, sandpipers, Wilson snipes or jacksnipes, snipes,

13 stilts, plovers, willets and yellow legs.

wild turkey, and chukar partridge.

14 Nongame birds. All wild birds not defined herein as 15 upland game birds or migratory game birds, shall be deemed

16 nongame birds.

17 Game animals. Deer, elk, moose, antelope, caribou,

18 mountain sheep, mountain goat, mountain lion, and bear.

19 Fur-bearing animals. Marten or sable, otter, muskrat,

20 fisher, mink, beaver and black-footed ferret.

21 Predatory animals. Coyote, wolf, weasel, skunk and

22 civet caty . and bebeat.

23 Game fish. All species of the family salmonidae

24 (chars, trout, salmon, grayling, and whitefish); all species

25 of the genus stizostedion (sandpike or sauger and walleyed

- 1 pike of yellowpike perch); all species of the genus esox
- 2 (northern pike, pickerel and muskellunge); all species of
 - the genus micropeterus (bass); all species of the genus
- 4 polyodon (paddlefish) and all species of the genus acipenser
- 5 (sturgeon).

- 6 Wild buffalo. Buffalo or bison which have not been
- 7 reduced to captivity."
- 8 Section 2. Section 46-1902, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to
- 9 read as follows:
- 90 "46-1902. Meaning of term "wild animal." For the
- 11 purpose of this act the term "wild animal" shall include
- 12 wolf, coyote, lynx, believer, and any other animal causing
- 13 depredations upon livestock."
- 14 Section 3. Section 46-1903, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 "46-1903. Department to supervise destruction of
- 17 predatory animals--cooperation with other
- ls agencies--administration of moneys. (1) The department of
- 19 livestock shall conduct the destruction, extermination, and
- 20 control of wild animals including wolf, coyote, lynx,
- 21 besteat and other wild animals predatory in nature and
- 22 capable of killing, destroying, maining, or injuring
- 23 domestic livestock or domestic poultry; and the protection
- 24 and safeguarding of livestock and poultry in this state,
- 25 against depredations from these animals. The department

- 1 shall formulate the practical programs for accomplishing
- 2 these objectives in this state, and for carrying out the
- 3 programs in an efficient and practical manner, responsive to
- 4 the need for control in each area of this state. The
- 5 department shall adopt rules applicable to predatory animal
- 6 control, which are necessary and proper for the systematic
- 7 destruction of the wild animals by hunting, trapping, and
- 8 poisoning operations, and payments of bounties. The
- 9 department shall make field, area, range, or other orders
- 10 and instructions, including orders and instructions to
- 11 hunter and trapper personnel and others, which are
- 12 appropriate in the various areas, at different seasons of
- 13 the year, taking into consideration the habits, presence,
- 14 migrations, or movements of the animals, and their attacks
- 15 on livestock and poultry, either singly or in packs or
- 16 bands. The department shall cooperate with authorized
- 17 representatives of the federal government, including the
- 18 Biological Survey and the Fish and Wild Life Service, the
- 19 state fish and game commission, boards of county
- 20 commissioners, voluntary associations of stockgrowers,
- 21 sheepgrowers, ranchers, farmers, and sportsmen, and
- 22 corporations and individuals, in the systematic destruction
- 23 of wild animals by hunting, trapping, and poisoning
- 24 operations.
- 25 (2) The department shall administer and expend for

predatory animal extermination and control all money which is made available to it, including the money from the levy under section 84-5214, and all money which is made available to the department by appropriations made by the legislature for predatory animal control by the department. The department shall expend the funds for predatory animal control by all effective means, including employment of hunters, trappers, and other personnel, procurement of traps, poisons, equipment, and supplies, and payment of bounties in the discretion of the department, responsive to the necessities of control in various areas of the state.

(3) This section does not interfere with or impair the power and duties of the fish and game commission in the control of predatory animals by the commission, as authorized by law, nor the obligation of the commission to expend its funds in cooperation with the department, for predatory animal control, as required by law. Funds of the fish and game commission for the cooperative predatory animal control shall be administered and expended by the fish and game commission."
