The names of the voting membership selected by the high school trustees shall be submitted in writing to the secretary of the board and shall be the only members of such district's trustees eligible to vote on joint board matters unless such list is revised in writing by the high school trustees.

Each voting member shall be entitled to cast one vote,

1 individually, upon every matter subnitted to the joint board for a vote."
