That in order to safeguard life. health and 12 property, and to promote the public welfare, there is a new 13 R.C.M. section numbered 82A-1602.28 that reads as follows: 14 82A-1602.28. Board of soil classifiers -- appointment -- qualifications -- terms -- removal. (1) There is a board 15 16 of soil classifiers. 17 (2) The board consists of three (3) members appointed 18 by the governor. Each member of the board shall be a 19 citizen of the United States and a resident of this state

for at least two (2) years. At least two (2) members must be professional soil classifiers who have had at least four (4) years practice of soil classifying as defined in subsection (7) of section (2). One member may be a citizen at large.

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(3) Each member shall serve a term of three (3) years

1 staggered so that the term of one member expires on June 30 2 each year. Initial appointments made following the 3 effective date of this section shall be for terms of one (1), two (2), or three (3) years, in order to stagger the 4 terms in subsequent years. 5 6 (4) The governor may remove an appointed member of the 7 board for misconduct, incompetence, or neglect of duty, after notice and hearing. 8 Section 2. Definitions. As used in this chapter: 9 (1) "Soil classifier" 10 means a professional soil 11 classifier as defined in subsection (2) of this section. 12 (2) "Professional soil classifier" means a person who 13 by reason of his special knowledge of the physical, chemical 14 and biological sciences applicable to soils as natural 15 bodies and of the methods and principles of soil 16 classification as acquired by soils education and soil 17 classification experience in the formation, morphology, description and mapping of soils is qualified to practice 18 19 soil classifying and who has been duly licensed by the board 20 of soil classifiers.

(3) "Soil classifier-in-training" means a person who
complies with the requirements for education and character
and who has passed an examination in the fundamental soil
and related subjects as provided for in sections 4, 5, 6,
and 7 of this chapter.

1 (4) "Soil" means all of the groups of natural bodies occupying the unconsolidated portion of the earth's surface capable of supporting plant life and having properties due to the combined effect of climate and living organisms, as modified by topography and time, upon parent materials.

6 (5) "Kind of soil" means a group of natural bodies that has a discrete combination of landscape, morphological, 7 8 chemical and physical properties.

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9 (6) "Soil classification" means plotting the 10 boundaries, describing and evaluating the kinds of soil as to their behavior and response to management under the 11 12 various uses.

13 (7) "Practice of soil classifying and practice of 14 professional soil classifying" means any service or work the adequate performance of which requires education in the 15 physical, chemical, biological and soil sciences, training 16 17 and experience in the application of the special knowledge of these sciences to soil classification, the soil 18 19 classification by accepted principles and methods, investigation, evaluation and consultation on the effect of 20 21 measured, observed, and inferred soil properties upon the 22 various uses, the preparation of soil descriptions, maps and 23 reports and interpretive drawings, maps and reports of soil 24 properties and the effect of soil properties upon the 25 various uses, and the effect of the various uses upon kinds

of soil, any of which embraces such service or work either 1 2 public or private incidental to the practice of soil з classifying.

4 A person is practicing or offering to practice soil 5 classifying within the meaning and intent of this chapter when he by verbal claim, sign, advertisement, letterhead, 6 7 card or use of some other title represents himself to be a 8 soil classifier. This does not include the practice of soil 9 classifying by persons exempt under the provisions of 10 section 3(2) nor the work ordinarily performed by persons 11 sample and test soil for fertility status or who 12 construction materials and engineering surveys and soundings 13 to determine soil properties influencing the design and construction of engineering and architectural projects. A 14 15 person does not practice soil classifying unless he offers 16 soil classifying services to or performs soil classifying 17 services for the public.

18 (8) "Departmment" means the department of professional 19 and occupational licensing provided for in Title 82A, 20 chapter 16.

21 (9) "Board" means the board of soil classifiers 22 established in section 82A-1602.28.

23 (10) "Responsible charge" means direct control and 24 personal supervision of soil classification.

25 Section 3. Right to practice restricted -- exemptions.

(1) A person may not practice or offer to practice
 professional soil classifying unless he is registered with
 the board of soil classifiers and licensed to practice by
 the board, or unless he is exempt under subsection (2) of
 this section.

(2) This chapter does not prevent or restrict:

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7 (a) Temporary permits. The practice or offer to . 8 practice soil classifying by a person not a resident or having no established place of business in this state 9 provided such person is legally qualified by the provisions 10 11 of this chapter to practice soil classifying as defined 12 herein in his own state which extends similar privileges to 13 persons registered under this chapter provided the person 14 makes application accompanied by the appropriate application 15 fee to the board in writing prior to his practicing or 16 offering to practice soil classifying. The board may grant 17 a temporary permit for a definite period of time not to 18 exceed one year to do a specific job only.

(b) Employees and subordinates. The work of an employee or a subordinate of a person holding a certificate of registration under this chapter or an employee of a person practicing lawfully under subsection (1) of this section, provided such work does not include final soil classifying decisions and is done under the direct supervision of and verified by a person holding a

certificate of registration under this chapter or a person
 practicing lawfully under subsection (1) of this section.

3 (c) The practice of soil classifying by any person 4 regularly employed to perform soil classifying services 5 solely for his employer or for a subsidiary or affiliated 6 corporation of his employer providing the soil classifying 7 performed is in connection with the property, products or 8 services of his employer.

9 Section 4. General requirements for licensing --10 professional soil classifier. To be eligible for licensing 11 as a professional soil classifier or certification as soil 12 classifier-in-training, an applicant must be of good 13 character and reputation and shall submit a written 14 application to the board containing such information as the 15 board may require, together with five (5) references, three 16 (3) of which shall be professional soil classifiers having 17 personal knowledge of his soil classification experience; or 18 in the case of an application for certification as a soil 19 classifier-in-training, by three (3) character references.

20 Section 5. Licensing without examination --21 professional soil classifier. An applicant otherwise 22 qualified shall be admitted to be licensed as a professional 23 soil classifier without examination within one (1) year 24 after July 1, 1975, if he is:

25 (1) A person of good character who has been a resident

of the state of Montana for at least one (1) year
 immediately preceding the date of his application and was a
 practicing soil classifier on July 1, 1975, and meets the
 requirements of this chapter and has performed work of a
 character satisfactory to the board; or,

6 (2) A person holding a certificate of registration in
7 the practice of soil classifying on the basis of comparable
8 gmalifications issued to him by a proper authority of
9 another state, possession or territory of the United States
14 and who in the opinion of the board meets the requirements
11 of this chapter.

12 Section 6. Registration and licensing with examinations
13 -- professional soil classifier. An applicant otherwise
14 qualified shall be registered and licensed as a professional
15 soil classifier if he has successfully passed an examination
16 is the principles and practice of soil classifying as
17 prescribed by the board and has one (1) of the following
18 additional qualifications:

19 (1) Is a graduate of a soils curriculum approved by 20 the board as satisfactory and with a specific record of an additional four (4) years or more of soil classification 21 22 experience of a grade and character which indicates to the 23 board that the applicant is competent to practice soil 24 classifying and who holds valid soil а classifier-in-training certificate; or, 25

(2) Is a person who has satisfactorily completed a
 soils curriculum not approved by the board and eight (0)
 years or more of experience in soil classification work of a
 character and grade which indicates to the board that the
 applicant is competent to practice soil classifying; or,

(3) Is a person who holds a valid soil
classifier-in-training certificate with a specific record of
four (4) years or more of soil classification experience as
a soil classifier-in-training of a grade and character which
indicates to the board that the applicant is competent to
practice soil classifying; or,

12 (4) Is a person with experience of not less than four
13 (4) years of soil classification research or as a teacher of
14 soils in a college or university offering an approved soils
15 curriculum of four (4) years or more, and a minimum of two
16 (2) years of soil classification experience of a character
17 and grade which indicates to the board that the applicant is
18 competent to practice soil classifying.

19 Section 7. Qualifications of soil classifier-in-.
20 training. Unless otherwise qualified, a person shall be
21 certified as a soil classifier-in-training, which
22 certification is valid for four (4) years, if he is a person
23 who is:

24 (1) A graduate of a soil curriculum approved by the25 board and has passed an examination in the fundamentals of

1 soil classification; or,

2 (2) An applicant who has completed a soil curriculum 3 not approved by the board and who has a specific record of 4 four (4) years of soil classification experience of a grade 5 and character satisfactory to the board and who passes an 6 examination in the fundamentals of soil classification.

7 Section 8. Applications. Application for license as a 8 professional soil classifier or for certification as a soil 9 classifier-in-training shall be on a form prescribed and 10 furnished by the board, shall contain statements made under 11 oath showing the applicant's education, a detailed summary 12 of his experience, and references as required by this chapter and shall be accompanied by an application fee 13 14 established by the board of not less than five dollars (\$5) 15 nor more than twenty-five dollars (\$25).

16 Section 9. Registration and licensing fees.
17 Registration and licensing fees shall be charged by the
18 department as follows:

(1) The original licensing fee for professional soil
 classifiers shall not exceed forty dollars (\$40), and as set
 by the board.

(2) The registration fee for soil
classifier-in-training certification shall not exceed twenty
dollars (\$20), and as set by the board.

25 Section 10. Powers of the board. The board may:

1 (1) make rules encompassing a code of ethics which 2 shall be binding on all persons licensed under or subject to 3 this chapter;

4 (2) provide by rule for the issuance, display and
5 setting an annual renewal fee for every person properly
6 qualified to be licensed or renewed by the board.

7 (3) devise examinations, to be administered by the 8 department under section 82A-1603, to applicants for 9 licensing as professional soil classifiers or for 10 certification as a soil classifier-in-training.

(4) sit in judgment in hearings held under section
82A-1605(2) on the suspension or revocation of a license.

13 Section 11. Department to provide supporting services. 14 The department shall provide supporting services to the 15 board as directed under section 82A-1603, and shall make an 16 annual report on behalf of the board concerning its activities and finances. The department shall, within the 17 appropriation of the board, reimburse appointed members for 18 their mileage and necessary actual expenses while on the 19 business of the board, and may pay compensation of 20 21 twenty-five dollars (\$25) to each member for each day 22 actually engaged in business of the board.

23 Section 12. Violation and penalties. (1) A person24 commits a misdemeanor if he:

25 (a) practices or offers to practice professional soil

l classifying in this state without being licensed or exempt: 2 (b) presents or attempts to use a license of another; (c) gives false or forged evidence of any kind to the 3 board or any member thereof in obtaining or attempting to 4 5 obtain a license: (d) falsely impersonates any other licenses; 6 7 (e) attempts to use an expired or revoked or 8 nonexistent license; (f) practices or offers to prectice when not 9

10 qualified;

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11 (g) falsely claims that he is licensed under this
12 chapter; or

13 (h) violates any provision of this chapter.

14 (2) A person, firm, partnership, organization,
15 association or other entity is guilty of a misdemeanor if he
16 or it uses or employs the words "soil classifier" or
17 "professional soil classifier" or any modification or
18 derivative thereof in its name or form of business or
19 activity except as authorized by this chapter.

20 Section 13. Attorney for board. The attorney general 21 of the state shall render to the board opinions on all 22 guestions of law relating to the interpretation of this act 23 or arising in administration thereof. The attorney general 24 shall further act as attorney for the said board in all 25 actions and proceedings brought by or against it under or
