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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 11-1804, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to read as follows:

"11-1804. Police commission required in first--and second-class-cities--other-cities-and-towns-may-provide--for commission-by-ordinance: all cities and towns. In all cities of--the--first--and--second-class and towns the mayor or, in those cities operating under the commission-manager plan, the manager thereof, shall nominate, and with the consent of the city council or commission appoint three residents of such city or town, who shall have the qualifications required by law to hold a municipal office therein, and who shall constitute a board to be known by the name of "police commission" who shall hold office for three years and that one such member must be appointed annually, at the first regular meeting of the city council or commission in May of each year. Provided, that at the first meeting of the

council or commission in the month of May after the passage
the commission-manager plan, the manager thereof, subject to
the approval of the council or commission, shall appoint
three members of such police commission, one to serve for
one year, one for two years and one for three years from the
date of their appointment and confirmation.

The compensation of the members of such board shall be fixed by the city council or commission not to exceed ten dollars (\$10) per day, nor more than fifty dollars (\$50) per month for any month for each member in cities of the first and second class.
