Except as herein provided, any person not a resident as defined in section 26-202.3, but who is twelve (12) years of age or older, upon payment of the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25) to any agent of the fish and game commission authorized to issue fishing and hunting licenses shall be entitled to a Class B-1 license, which shall entitle the holder thereof to pursue, hunt, shoot, kill and possess game birds as authorized by the rules and regulations of the commission.
