11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:						
12	Section 1. Pursuant to Article V, Section 6 of the						
13	Montana Constitution, the length of all legislative sessions						
14	after the 44th regular session is increased to one hundred						
15	twenty (120) days. Each session shall be divided into two						
16	(2) parts, with the first part to commence on the first						
17	Monday in January and the second part to commence on the						
18	last Monday in December. Each part shall be sixty (60) days						
19	in length and any business, bill or resolution pending at						
20	recess of the first part shall carry over with the same						
21	status to the second part.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 282 increases the limit on the length of legislative sessions after the Forty-Fourth regular session to 120 days and divides each session into two parts beginning on the first Monday in January and last Monday in December.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. The Legislature will not meet in 1976 under current or proposed law; biennial sessions will continue.

2. The Legislature would meet for 60 days in FY 77, 60 days in FY 78, and 60 days in FY 79 under the proposed law.

3. The Legislature will meet for 90 days in FY 77, will not meet in FY 78, and will meet for 90 days in FY 79 under current law.

4. Estimated costs of each legislature will be \$20,000 per day.

5. Estimated research costs are \$180,000 for a 90 day session and \$120,000 for a 60 day session.

6. Costs for printing, mailing, updating codes and other services will not be significantly affected by the length of session.

CONCLUSION:

Enactment of Senate Bill 282 would result in a decrease of \$660,000 in expenditures during the 75-77 biennium due to a 30 day decrease in length of sessions. In the 77-79 biennium, there would be an increase in expenditures of \$660,000 due to a 30 day increase in length of sessions.
