In compliance with a written request received February 5_, 19 , there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for $\qquad$ pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty -Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 291 provides that motor vehicle number plates shall be issued for a minimum period of four years and that those issued in 1976 shall be a graphic change commemorating the bicentennial celebration of the founding of the United States.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

1. Cost estimates are' based upon budget information received from the license plate manufacturing division of the state prison.
2. Approximately 120,000 sets of license plates per year will be issued after the year of original issue.
3. Additional equipment amounting to $\$ 91,650$ is needed in 1976 to purchase the graphic bicentennial plate. $\$ 42,600$ of this equipment would have to be purchased to replace worn equipment by 1979 under any alternative.
4. Costs include $\$ 80,000$ per year tag production when appropriate.

## FISCAL IMPACT:

The following four-year period estimates are being provided to portray various license plate alternatives:


## CONCLUSION:

Enactment of Senate Bill 291 would result in four-year reductions in license plate expenditures of \$439,063.
