8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

9 Section 1. State treasurer. (1) The state treasurer
 10 shall hold office for a term of four (4) years beginning on
 11 the first Monday of January next succeeding election, and
 12 until a successor is elected and qualified.

13 (2) The state treasurer shall reside at the seat of
 14 government, there keep the public records of his office, and
 15 perform those duties as are required by law.

16 Section 2. Election. The state treasurer shall be
 17 elected by the qualified electors at the general election to
 18 be held in November, 1976 and each four (4) years
 19 thereafter.

20 Section 3. Qualifications. No person is eligible to
 21 the office of state treasurer unless he is twenty-five (25)
 22 years of age or older at the time of his election and is a
 23 citizen of the United States who has resided within the
 24 state two (2) years next preceding his election.

25 Section 4. Duties. The state treasurer shall have the

1 duties and powers provided by law.

2 Section 5. Vacancy in office. If the office of state
 3 treasurer becomes vacant by death, resignation, or
 4 disability as determined by law, the governor shall appoint
 5 a qualified person to serve in that office until the next
 6 general election and until a successor is elected and
 7 qualified. The person elected to fill a vacancy shall hold

INTRODUCED BY MATHERS, MANNING, TURNAGE, FLYNN

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE STATE TREASURER BE AN ELECTED OFFICIAL, AND PROVIDING FOR ELECTION, QUALIFICATIONS, DUTIES, AND VACANCY IN OFFICE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. State treasurer. (1) The state treasurer shall hold office for a term of four (4) years beginning on the first Monday of January next succeeding election, and until a successor is elected and qualified.

(2) The state treasurer shall reside at the seat of government, there keep the public records of his office, and perform those duties as are required by law.

Section 2. Election. The state treasurer shall be elected by the qualified electors at the general election to be held in November, 1976 and each four (4) years thereafter.

Section 3. Qualifications. No person is eligible to the office of state treasurer unless he is twenty-five (25) years of age or older at the time of his election and is a citizen of the United States who has resided within the state two (2) years next preceding his election.

Section 4. Duties. The state treasurer shall have the

duties and powers provided by law.

Section 5. Vacancy in office. If the office of state treasurer becomes vacant by death, resignation, or disability as determined by law, the governor shall appoint a qualified person to serve in that office until the next general election and until a successor is elected and qualified. The person elected to fill a vacancy shall hold the office until the expiration of the term for which his predecessor was elected.
