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9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10 Section 1. Section 68-1503, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to 11 read as follows:

12 "68-1503. Definitions. Unless the context requires13 otherwise, in this act:

14 (1) "Retirement system" means the public employees'15 retirement system created by this act.

16 (2) "Head of department" means the head of any 17 department, institution or branch of the state service which 18 directly pays salaries out of its income or which prepares, 19 approves and submits salary statements of its employees to 20 the department of administration, state auditor and state 21 treasurer for payment.

(3) "Member" means any person included in the
membership of the retirement system set forth in section
68-1601 and not excluded in section 68-1602, 68-1603 or
68-2510.

INTRODUCED BILL

(4) "Board" means the board of administration provided for in section 82A-210.

3 (5) "Employee" means any person employed by an employer 4 in any capacity whatever and whose salary is paid either by 5 warrant of the employer or from the fees or income of any 6 department or agency of the employer. "Employee" means 7 further any person deemed such pursuant to section 68-2510. 8 (6) "Retirement fund" means the public employees'

9 retirement account in the agency fund.

10 (7) "Service" means employment of an employee, except 11 as provided in sections 68-1604 and 68-1605.

12 (8) "Prior service" shall mean all service rendered as 13 an employee of the state before July 1, 1945, and all 14 service rendered as an employee of a contracting employer 15 before July 1, 1947. Prior service includes all service 16 rendered prior to July 1, 1945, as a member of the 17 legislative assembly or lieutenant governor of the state of 18 Montana.

19 (9) "Beneficiary" means the person so designated 20 pursuant to section 68-2401.

21 (10) "Compensation" means remuneration paid out of 22 funds controlled by an employer. The compensation of each 23 member of the legislative-assembly-and-the-lieutenant 24 governor-of-the-state-of-Montana legislature for any year 25 shall-be-deemed-to-be is that portion of the product of the

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daily compensation plus expenses for such position 1 2 multiplied by three hundred sixty (360), upon which such member elects to pay normal contributions during the year. 3

(11) "Final compensation" means a member's highest 4 5 average annual compensation during any three (3) consecutive years of membership service. 6

7 (12) "Regular interest" means interest at the rate set 8 from time to time by the board.

9 (13)"Normal contributions" means contributions 10 required by members under this act and any optional 11 contributions, made under the provisions of sections 68-1605 12 and 68-1906.

13 (14) "Additional contributions" means contributions by 14 members under the provisions of section 68-1903.

15 (15) "Accumulated normal contributions" means the sum 16 of all the normal contributions standing to the credit of a 17 member's individual account without interest.

18 (16) "Accumulated additional contributions" means the 19 sum of all the additional contributions standing to the 20 credit of a member's individual account, together with the 21 regular interest thereon.

22 (17) "Accumulated contributions" means the sum of accumulated normal contributions and accumulated additional 23 24 contributions.

25 (18) "Pension" means payments for life derived from -31 contributions made from the state controlled funds, or in 2 the case of members from contracting employers, from the 3 funds of such contracting employers, as provided in this 4 act.

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5 (19) "Annuity" means payments for life derived from 6 contributions made by a member as provided in this act.

7 (20) "Retirement allowance" means the periodic benefit 8 payable following service, early or disability retirement.

9 (21) "Actuarial equivalent" means a benefit of equal 10 value when computed upon the basis of the actuarial tables 11 in use by the system.

12 (22) "Actuary" means the actuary retained by the board 13 in accordance with section 68-1804.

14 (23) "Benefit" means the retirement allowance. survivorship allowance, death benefit or refund of 15 16 accumulated contributions provided by this act. '

17 (24) "Contracting employer" means any political 18 subdivision or governmental entity which has contracted to 19 come into the system.

20 (25) "Employer" means the state of Montana, its 21 university or any of the colleges, schools, components or 22 units thereof for the purposes of this act, or any political 23 subdivision or governmental entity which has contracted to 24 come into the system.

25 (26) "Membership service" means service with respect to

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1 which normal contributions and employer contributions are 2 paid. A member of the legislative assembly and a lieutenant governor of the state of Montana shall be credited with 3 4 membership service for that portion of each year for which 5 he pays normal contributions pursuant to section 68-1503 6 (10).

7 (27) "Survivorship allowance" means payments for life to the beneficiary of a deceased member as provided in Title 8 9 68, chapter 23.

10 "Creditable service" means the aggregate of (28) 11 membership service and prior service. A member employed on a 12 part-time basis shall receive credit for a year of service for each fiscal year during which such member was employed 13 14 throughout the year and was engaged in his duties the full 15 amount of time he was required by his employment to be so 16 engaged.

17 (29) "Employer contributions" means payments to the 18 retirement fund from appropriations of the state of Montana 19 pursuant to section 68-2504 and from contracting employers 20 pursuant to the contracts between them and the board.

21 (30) "Written application" means a written instrument duly executed and filed with the board and containing all 22 23 information required by the board, including such proofs of 24 age as the board shall deem necessary.

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25 (31) "Retirement" means withdrawal from active service

with a retirement allowance granted under the provisions of 1 2 this act.

(32) "Disability" and "incapacity for performance of 3 4 duty" referred to herein as a basis of retirement, means 5 disability of permanent duration or disability of extended 6 and uncertain duration, as determined by the board on the basis of competent medical opinion. 7 8 (33) "Fiscal year" means any year commencing with July

9 1 and ending June 30 next following."

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 299 includes daily expenses as compensation for legislators in the Public Employees Retirement System.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. Legislators comprise less than 1% of public employee membership.

2. The Public Employees Retirement System is optional for legislators.

». The employer will contribute 5.2% of gross salary to the Public Employees Retirement fund effective July 1, 1975.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Enactment of Senate Bill 299 would increase the Public Employees Retirement System contribution and expenditures since the "compensation" basis for legislators would be expanded to include daily expenses. The exact amount of increase cannot be estimated since the number of legislators who would elect voluntary enrollment in the public employees retirement system is unknown.

CONCLUSION:

Enactment of Senate Bill 299 would have very little effect on the funding of the Public Employees Retirement System due to the relatively small portion of the membership affected.

Moneys received from the sale or disposition of a district's interest in a vocational-technical secondary school shall be credited to the debt service fund, building fund, general fund or any combination of these three funds, at the discretion of the trustees."
