DESCRIPTION OF PROPOS	SED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 317 provides for the establishment and financing of Regional Special Education Services.

FISCAL IMPACT:/

Enactment of Senate Bill 317 would not alter expenditures or revenue. It would merely alter the flow of funds. Presently funds are provided to school districts; Senate Bill 317 would provide assistance directly to the Special Education Regional Centers. There are presently five special education regional centers. It is assumed that no new centers will be established and that the number of students served will remain at the current level during the biennium.
