Section 1. Section 32-1123.3, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to read as follows:
n32-1123.3. Width. A venicle, unladen or with load, may not have a total outside width in excess of one hundred two (102) inchesf--exeept-bases--whieh-may--have-a-totai outsiae-width-not-to-exeeed-one-handred-two-tiezt-inehes-中his-bus-wideh-is-ałłewed-oniy-on-pavee-highways-twenty-fzet feet-or-mere-in-wideh. This restriction does not apply to an implement of husbandry or a vehicle used for hauling hay moved or propelled upon the nighway during daylight nours for a distance of not more than one inudred (100) miles, if tine movement is incidental to the faming operations of the Owner of the implement of husbandry or the venicle used for nauling nay. If the implement of husbandry or the veinicle used for nauiing hay has a width in excess of twelve (12) feet, it sinall be preceded by flagmen escorts for the purpose of warning other highway users; provided, however.

1 that this restriction does not apply to dual wheel tractors 2 under fifteen (15) feet overall width which are used in 3 farming operations.
