DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 364 establishes a centralized communications equipment maintenance program within the Department of Administration.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Personnel and equipment within the Department of Highways, Natural Resources, and Justice will be transferred to the Department of Administration.
- 2. The proposed program will be supported entirely by the Radio/Microwave Communications Revolving Account (07265). Agencies will be billed for communications maintenance services performed.
- 3. Estimated expenditures are based on FY76 state agency budgets relative to communications maintenance expenditures.

Estimated expenditures for maintenance of communications equipment under proposed law	281,360	283,678
Net increase (decrease) in expenditures	\$ 1,360	\$(1,322)

CONCLUSION:

Enactment of SB 364 will have virtually no impact on the cost of maintaining communications equipment during the biennium. It will provide a centralized maintenance program for all state communications equipment, and provide funding through a revolving account.
