An act requiring the division of motor vehicles to issue special identification cards, upon request, to any resident of Montana 65 years of age or older for a fee of \$2.00.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. 75,643 people will be 65 years or older.
- 2. 80 percent will request a card.
- 3. 70 percent will renew the card after two years.
- 4. 10 percent each year will be new applicants or requests for replacements.
- 5. Cost of card, application, postage and manpower will be \$1.00 per card.
