Description of Proposed Legislation

A proposal to change the name of Eastern Montana College to Eastern Montana University.

Long-Range Effects:

The suggested change in the name of Eastern Montana College to Eastern Montana University implies that the institution should expand its educational scope and mission considerably. The fiscal impact of enhancing Eastern's mission is not readily discernible in the short run. In the long-run, Eastern would have to strenghten and expand its science programs to include more graduate degrees and provide for a broader role in organized and departmental research. The costs of such changes would be significant.
