In compliance with a written request received January 5, 19 77, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for House Bill 60 pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly.

Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

This bill repeals the \$1 camper decal administered by the Miscellaneous Tax Division, Department of Revenue.

ASSUMPTIONS

- 1) Expenditures administering the camper decal program will equal the revenue generated by the program throughout the biennium. This is currently the case.
- 2) A 5% increase in camper decal revenue will occur in FY 77, 78 and 79. Estimates provided by Miscellaneous Tax Division, Department of Revenue.

LOCAL IMPACT

There may be a decrease in motor vehicle revenues on the county level because the camper decal is the only enforcement measure used to assure that property taxes are paid on campers.
