Acquisition, importation, and propagation 13 of fish, Jame, game birds, and fur-bearing animals ---14 introduction and propagation of waterfow] food. The 15 commission may: 16 (1) Acquire by gift, purchase, capture, or otherwise 17 any fish, game, game birds, or animals, for propagation, 18 experimental, or scientific purposes. 19 (2) Provide for the importation of game birds and game 20 and fur-bearing animals and for the protection, propagation, 21 and distribution of imported or native birds and animals. 22 (3) Use fish and game funds necessary for the 23 construction, maintenance, operation, upkeep, and repair of 24 fish hatcheries, game farms, or other property or means and 25 INTRODUCED BILL

Notice of sale 16 describing the lands or waters to be disposed of shall be 17 published once a week for three-{3} successive weeks in a 18 newspaper with general circulation printed and published in 19 the county where the lands or waters are situated, or if no 20 newspaper is published in that county then in any newspaper 21 with general circulation in that county. The notice shall 22 advertise for cash bids to be presented to the commission or the director within thirty-(30) days from the date of the 23 24 first publication. Each bid must be accompanied by a 25 cashier's check or cash deposit in an amount equal to ten

1 percent-(10%) of the amount bid. The highest bid shall be 2 accepted upon payment of the balance due within ten-(10) 3 days after mailing notice by registered mail to the highest 4 bidder. If that bidder defaults on payment of the balance 5 due, then the next highest bidders shall be similarly 6 notified in succession until a sale is completed. Deposits 7 shall be returned to the unsuccessful bidders except bidders 8 defaulting after notification. The commission shall reserve 9 the right to reject any bids which do not equal or exceed 10 the full market value of the lands and waters as determined 11 by the commission. The commission shall convey the lands and 12 waters by deed without covenants of warranty, executed by 13 the governor, or in his absence or disability by the 14 lieutenant governor, attested by the secretary of state, and 15 further countersigned by the chairman of the commission. The 16 deed shall be attested by the secretary of the commission. 17 but need not be acknowledged.
