In compliance with a written request received <u>February 8</u>, 19 77, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>House Bill 119</u> pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 119 provides for community education programs within the existing adult education framework.

FISCAL IMPACT:

FY 76 school district expenditures for adult education totaled \$747,000. It is probable that enactment of House Bill 119 will increase such expenditures but the amount is indeterminable.

### TECHNICAL NOTE:

The terms "adult education fund", "community education fund" and "adult-community education fund" are all used in the bill to refer to the same accounting entity. Consistent usage of the general term "adult-community education fund" would enhance the clarity of the proposed legislation.
