4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY
5 FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS FOR THE BIENNIUM ENDING JUNE 30, 1979,
6 AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATING TO THE
7 APPROPRIATIONS."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10 Section 1. Definitions. For the purposes of this act,
11 unless otherwise stated the following definitions apply:

12 (1) "Agency" includes each state office, department,
13 division, board, commission, council, committee,
14 institution, unit of the university system, or other entity
15 or instrumentality of the executive branch, office of the
16 legislative branch, or office of the judicial branch of
17 state government.

18 (2) "Capital project" means acquisition of land or
19 improvements, planning, capital construction, renovation,
20 furnishing, or major repair projects authorized in this act.

21 (3) "Approved budget amendment" means approval by the
22 budget director of a request submitted through the
23 construction and maintenance division of the department of
24 administration to transfer excess funds appropriated to a
25 capital project within an agency to increase the

1 appropriations of another capital project within that agency
2 or to obtain financing to expand a project from funds which
3 were not available for consideration by the legislature but
4 which have become available.

5 (4) "BPICA" means bond proceeds and insurance
6 clearance account; "FPRA" means federal and private revenue
7 account; and "ERA" means earmarked revenue account.

8 Section 2. Expansion required to be authorized. No
9 existing capital project may be expanded beyond the scope of
10 the project as approved by the 45th legislature unless the
11 capital project expansion is authorized by an approved
12 budget amendment.

13 Section 3. Additional funding. If a capital project is
14 jointly financed by an appropriation or appropriations from
15 state sources as well as by appropriations from other
16 sources, the funds provided by appropriation from state
17 sources shall be decreased by the amount that the funds
18 received from other sources exceed the amount appropriated
19 by the legislature in the 1977 biennial budget if the
20 decrease does not jeopardize the receipt of the funds to be
21 received from other sources.

22 Section 4. Federal funds for administration. All
23 federal funds received as a reimbursement for the cost of
24 administering the federal funds when the cost was financed
25 from the general fund shall revert to the general fund.

1 Section 5. Reappropriation. Notwithstanding any other
 2 provision of law, the remaining balances on capital projects
 3 previously appropriated are hereby reappropriated until June
 4 30, 1979, for the purposes for which originally
 5 appropriated.

6 Section 6. Severability. If a part of this act is
 7 invalid, all valid parts that are severable from the invalid
 8 part remain in effect. If a part of this act is invalid in
 9 one or more of its applications, the part remains in effect
 10 in all valid applications that are severable from the
 11 invalid applications.

HOUSE BILL NO. 144

INTRODUCED BY DRISCOLL, MELOY

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS FOR THE BIENNIUM ENDING JUNE 30, 1979, AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATING TO THE APPROPRIATIONS."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

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(2) "Capital project" means acquisition of land or improvements, planning, capital construction, renovation, furnishing, or major repair projects authorized in this act.

(3) "Approved budget amendment" means approval by the budget director of a request submitted through the construction and maintenance division of the department of administration to transfer excess funds appropriated to a capital project within an agency to increase the

appropriations of another capital project within that agency or to obtain financing to expand a project from funds which were not available for consideration by the legislature but which have become available.

(4) "BPICA" means ~~bond proceeds and insurance clearance account~~ ACCOUNT NUMBER 06142 IN THE BOND PROCEEDS AND INSURANCE CLEARANCE FUND; "FPRA" means federal and private revenue account; and "ERA" means earmarked revenue account.

Section 2. Expansion required to be authorized. No existing capital project may be expanded beyond the scope of the project as approved by the 45th legislature unless the capital project expansion is authorized by an approved budget amendment.

Section 3. Additional funding. If a capital project is jointly financed by an appropriation or appropriations from state sources as well as by appropriations from other sources, the funds provided by appropriation from state sources shall be decreased by the amount that the funds received from other sources exceed the amount appropriated by the legislature in the 1977 biennial budget if the decrease does not jeopardize the receipt of the funds to be received from other sources.

Section 4. Federal funds for administration. All federal funds received as a reimbursement for the cost of

HOUSE BILL NO. 144

INTRODUCED BY DRISCOLL, MELOY

(3) "Approved budget amendment" means approval by the budget director of a request submitted through the construction and maintenance division of the department of administration to transfer excess funds appropriated to a

capital project within an agency to increase the appropriations of another capital project within that agency or to obtain financing to expand a project from funds which were not available for consideration by the legislature but which have become available.

(4) "BPICA" means ~~bond proceeds and insurance clearance account~~ ACCOUNT NUMBER 06142 IN THE BOND PROCEEDS AND INSURANCE CLEARANCE FUND; "FPRA" means federal and private revenue account; and "ERA" means earmarked revenue account.

Section 2. Expansion required to be authorized. No existing capital project may be expanded beyond the scope of the project as approved by the 45th legislature unless the capital project expansion is authorized by an approved budget amendment OR AND CERTIFICATE OF NEED ASSESSMENT IS APPLIED TO ANY MEDICAL OR LONG TERM CARE FACILITY.

Section 3. Additional funding. If a capital project is jointly financed by an appropriation or appropriations from state sources as well as by appropriations from other sources, the funds provided by appropriation from state sources shall be decreased by the amount that the funds received from other sources exceed the amount appropriated by the legislature in the 1977 biennial budget if the decrease does not jeopardize the receipt of the funds to be received from other sources.
