A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO CREATE A SCREENING COMMITTEE IN EACH HOUSE OF THE LEGISLATURE; TO REQUIRE THAT ANY BILL IN EXCESS OF FIVE INTRODUCED BY AN INDIVIDUAL LEGISLATOR BE APPROVED BY THE SCREENING COMMITTEE BEFORE IT MAY BE INTRODUCED INTO THE LEGISLATURE; AND TO PRESCRIBE THE COMMITTEE'S PROCEDURE."

WHEREAS, the number of bills introduced into the legislature each session is far in excess of the number that an individual legislator can intelligently assess and pass upon.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Screening committee -- appointment and composition. (1) There is a screening committee in each house of the legislature. The committee shall be composed of seven members, no more than four of whom may be of one political party.

(2) The screening committee shall be appointed at the same time and in the same manner as all other standing committees.

Section 2. Limit on number of bills introduced by

individual legislator. Each legislator may introduce five
bills that have not been submitted to and approved by the
screening committee. If he desires to introduce a sixth or
subsequent bill, the bill must first be approved for
introduction by the appropriate screening committee.

Section 3. Duties of screening committee. (1) The screening committee shall determine whether the bills submitted to it should be introduced into the legislature, giving consideration to the workload of the legislature, the importance of the bill, and the existence or absence of similar bills.

(2) Whenever a similar bill has already been introduced or is also pending before the committee, the committee shall notify the sponsor of the bill under consideration and the sponsor of the similar bill and request that a compromise be agreed upon between them.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HONTANA:

Section 1. Section 46-2901, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to read as follows:

\*46-2901. Definitions. When used in this chapter:

- 16 (2) "Livestock" means cattle, sheep, swine, horses,
