 Section 2. There is a new R.C.A. section numbered
 66-3208.1 that reads as follows:

7 66-3203.1. Additional qualifications -- three levels

9 (b) have received a bachelor's degree, based upon a 10 program primarily psychological in content, from an 11 accredited college or university and have subsequently 12 completed 2 years of training in psychology under the 13 supervision of a licensed clinical psychologist who has 14 furnished a written recommendation for the licensure of the 15 applicant.

16 Section 3. There is a new R.C.M. section numbered 17 66-3208.2 that reads as follows:

18 66-3208+2* Restrictions on private practice of 19 psychology. (1) A person may engage in the private 20 practice of psychology only if he:

21 (a) holds a level I license; or

(b) holds a level II license and practices incollaboration with a licensed clinical psychologist.
