House Bill 263 provides a partial service pension for paid firemen with five (5) years or more of active duty. Under the provisions of this proposed legislation, a fireman who is eligible to receive a partial service pension may either accept it or choose to receive a cash refund.

The refund or partial service pension must be paid out of the disability and pension fund of the respective city or town and must consist of monthly payments in an amount equal to the number of years of the fireman's service divided by 20 and multiplied by one-half of the sum last received by the fireman as monthly compensation for his service as an active member of the fire department.

FISCAL IMPACT:

No dollar estimate can be made for House Bill 263. The fiscal impact of the proposed legislation would be limited to those cities and towns that maintain paid fire departments.

From past experience of the various Fire Department Relief Associations in first and second class cities in Montana, the number of terminations among firemen is relatively small. The majority of terminated firemen have had less than five (5) years of service at the time of termination. In these cases, no benefits would be available under the proposed legislation.
