With the approval of the department the 17 state hospital may transfer a patient residing at the center 18 to Galen state hospital. Unless a medical or psychiatric 19 20 emergency exists, fifteen-(15) days prior to the transfer the department shall notify the patient's parent, quardian, 21 22 or spouse, or if none is known, his nearest relative or 23 friend. In the case of an emergency transfer, the department shall send notice within seventy-two-{72} hours after the 24 time of transfer." 25
