The general fund budget amount determined for eacn school of a district under the schedules provided in this section shall be totaled to determine the maximum-general-fund-budget-without-a-voted-levy for such district.
(20) For the purpose of establishing the maximum-budgetwithout-a-vote amount for current year special education progran for a school district, the superintendent of public instruction will determine the total estimated cast of the special education program for the school district on the basis of a special education program budget submitted by the district. The budget will be prepared on forms provided by the superintendent of public instruction and will set out for each progran
(a) the estimated allowable costs associated with operating the program where allowable costs are as defined in section 75-7813.1;
(b) the number of pupils expected to be enrolles in the program; and
(c) any other data required by the superintendent of public instruction for budget justification purposes and to administer the provisions of this act section. the total amount of allowable costs approved by the superintendent of public instruction shall be the special education maximum-budget-without-a-vote amount for current year special education program purposes. The total amount of allowable costs that are approved for the special education budget shall not, under any condition, be less than the maximum-budqet-without-a-vote amount for one regular anB for each special full-time pupil in the school district.

In compliance with a written request received January 24 , 19 , there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for House Bill 365 pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legisiative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION: HB 365 provides for changes in the financial schedules for the maximum general fund budget for elementary and high school districts.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

1. The total average number belonging (ANB) will decline from 171,940 in FY77 to 169,460 in $F Y 78$ and 167,460 in FY79.
2. The state's taxable valuation will increase from $\$ 1.392$ billion in $F Y 77$ to $\$ 1.477$ billion in $F Y 78$ and $\$ 1.636$ billion in FY79.
3. Total allowable costs for special education will increase from $\$ 20.7$ million in FY 77 to $\$ 22.0$ million in FY 78 and $\$ 23.2$ million in FY79.
4. It is estimated that $11 \%$ of special ed. allowance will revert each year, reducing the following year's state equalization payments.

(d) subtract the amount determined in subsection (c) from the total authorized seneral fund budget amount for the school to determine the authorized general fund budget amount which shall be available for the high school district qeneral fund budget.

Ihe general fund budget amount determined for each school of a district under the schedules provided in this section shall be totaled to determine the maximum-general-fund-budget-without-a-voted-levy for such district.
(20) For the purpose of establishins the maximum-budgetwithout-a-vote amount for current year special education progran for a school district, the superintendent of Dusi:c instruction will determine the total estimated cost of the special education program for the school divtrict on the basis of a special education program budget su. itted by the district. The budget will be prepared on forms provided by the superintendent of public instruction and will set out for each program
(a) the estimated allowable costs associated with operatina the program where allowable costs are as defined in section 75-7813.1;
(t) the number of pupils expected to be enrolled in

(c) any other data required by the superintendent of public instruction for budget justification purposes and to a fominister the provisions of this aet section. The total amount of allowable costs approved by the superintendent of public instruction shall be the special education maximum-budget-without-a-vote amount for current year special education program purposes. The total amount of allowable costs that are approved for the special education budget shall not, under any condition, be less than the maximum-budqet-without-a-vote amount for one regular ANB for each special fułl-time pupil in the school district.
(21) If a special education program is implemented or expanded durinc a given school term too late to be included in the determination of the district maximum-budoet-without-a-vote for the school year as prescribed in this chapter, then subject to the approval of the program by the superintendent, under the emergency budget provisions of section 75-6723 (5), allowable costs approved under the budqeting provisions of section 75-6905 (20) for the operation of the program during the aiven year may be added to the maximum-budqet-without-a-vote amount for special education for the subsequent school year.
