  - Section 4. Meetings. (1) The task force shall meet at least twice a year. The time and location of meetings shall be determined by the task force and shall be publicized.
- 13 (2) All task force meetings shall be open to the 14 public.
  - (3) The meetings may be held anywhere in the state.
- Section 5. Reimbursement for expenses. A task force in member, while engaged in task force business, is entitled to reimbursement for travel as provided in 59-538, 59-539, and 59-801, including travel in Canada.
- Section 5. Information clearinghouse. (1) The cask

  21 force shall collect information related to the Cabin creek

  22 coal development.
  - (2) This information shall be sent to interested persons upon request. The task force shall develop a mailing list of the international, federal, state, and local

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- entities, both public and private, involved in activities
  concerning the Cabin Creek coal development and the
  communication and news media. The task force shall send to
  parties on the mailing list such information, as the task
  force considers of value to the recipient.
  - (3) The task force shall keep the citizens of Montana informed of activities associated with the Cabin Creek coal development.

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- 9 Section 7. Development of policy -- public hearings.
  10 (1) The task force shall develop management policies related
  11 to the Cabin Creek coal development.
- (2) These policies may only be developed followingadequate public hearings.
  - (3) The task force may present these policies at any public hearing or to any governmental agency whether international, national, state, or local.
- 17 (4) A policy may be adopted only by vote of a majority
  18 of the task force members.
- 19 (5) The task force may not represent a policy as a 20 policy of the United States without express approval from 21 the federal government.
- Section 8. Attendance at public meetings. Whenever possible the task force shall be represented at any meeting related to the Cabin Creek coal development.
- 25 Section 9. Leadership for technical activities. If the

- existing federal interagency task force, which was established by the United States state department in the fall of 1975, is continued, either in its present status or with an expanded state and local involvement, the Japin Craek task force shall provide leadership for the activities of the technical task force if the United States agrees to such a role.
- Section 10. Transitional section. Upon initially
  appointing the 11 members of the task force, the governor
  shall designate one of them as acting chairman until the
  first meeting of the commission. The acting chairman shall
  establish a time and place for the first meeting of the task
  force. The first meeting shall be held within 2 months of
  the effective date of this act.

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
