

ELECTION UF SCHODL DISIRICT TRUSTEES IN FIRST-CLASS
ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICIS LOCATED IN A COUNTY HAVING A
ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICIS LOCATED IN A COUNTY GAVING a
POPGLATION GREATER THAN 30,000 BY MEANS GF SINGLE-MEMSER
SUBDISTRICTS; AMENDING SECTIONS 75-5914.1 AND 75-5915,
R.C.M. 1947."
be it enacted by the legistafure of the staite of montana:
Section le Creation of single-member subdistricts in
certain first-class elementary school districtse (1) Eacn
first-class elementary school district located within a
county having a population greater than 30,000 shall be
subdivided into as many subdistricts as the school district
has trustees.
(2) Dae trustee shall be elected from ach
subdistrict.
(3) The county commissioners shall determine the
bounderies of each subdistrict and shall make a
redetermination of the boundaries:
(a) whenever two or more districts consolidate;
(b) winenever the district boundary is altered;
(C) whenever there is a change in the number of
trustees;
(d) whenever the population of the largest subaistrict exceeds that of the smallast oy lut of more of the total population of the school district;
(e) every lu years.

Section 2. Hearing on determination of boundaries. Sefore determining the boundaries of the subdistricts, the county commissioners shall nold public hearings.

Section 3. Criteria for determination of boundaries. (1) Each subdistrict shall be as nearly equal in population as is possiole. At the time the boundaries are determined or redetermined, the population difference between the largest and smallest subdistrict may not exceed $5 \%$ of the total population of the school district.
(2) The boundaries shall be drami as nearly as possible to produce compact subdistricts and to implement the principle of one man-one vote.
(3) As nearly as possible, subaistrict boundaries shall coincide with legislative district boundaries and precinct boundaries.

Section 4. dualifications of candidate for trustee. Any person who is qualified to vote in the school district election is eliuible for the office of trustae in any subdistrict. In candidate need not be a resident of the subdistrict he seeks to represent. No person may be a

candidate in more than one subdistrict.
Section 5. Nomination by petition. Any 20 persons qualified to vote in the school district election who are residents of a subdistrict may nominate a trustee candidate for that subdistrict by filing a petition with the clerk of the school district not less than 40 days before the election.

Section 6. Ballots. (1) A separate dallot shall be prepared for each subdistrict.
(2) The ballot shall show the names of the candidates for trustee of the subdistrict with a square in front of each name. There shall be several blank lines with squares in front to permit write-in votes. The order of the named candidates shall de determined by lot by the clerk of the school district.
(3) The elector shall vote by marking a cross in the square in front of the candidate's or write-in candidate's name.

Section 7. Conduct of election. (1) The trustees of each first-class elementary school district suoject to trustee sundistricting shall call a trustee election on the regular school election day. The trustee election shall be conducted in the manner prescribed for school elections whenever upplicable. the trustees in giving the notice required by 75-6409 shall specify which subdistricts will be

electing a trustee.
(2) A qualified elector must be a resident of a subdistrict to vote for trustee in that subdistrict.
Section Be Transition. (1) The school districts required to be subdistricted by this act shall be divided into subdistricts within á months of the effective date of this act by the county commissioners.
(2) The county comismioners shall assign each trustee of a district holding office on January 1. 1978. to a subdistrict by lot. When the 3-year term of that trustee expires, the electors of that subdistrict shall commence electing a trustee for the subdistrict.
Section 9. Section 75-5914-1, R.C.H. 1947, is amended to read as follows:
"75-5914-1. Nomination of candidates by petition in sertain first class elementary distriet districtse (1) Any twenty (20) electors qualified under the provisions of section 75-6410 of any first class elementary districti except for_a_district__losated_in_a__rounty_havial__a population greater than \(20_{2}\) QQQe may nominate by petition as many trustee candidates as there are trusteo positions subject to election at the ensuing election. The name of each person nominated for candidacy shall be submitted to the clerk of the district not less than forty (40) days before the regular school election day at which he is to be

a candidate. If there are different terms to be filled, the
term for which each candidate is nominated shall also be
indicated. The election shall be conducted with the ballot
as specified in section 75-5915."
    Section 10. Section 75-5915. R.C.M. 1947, is amanded
to read as follows:
    *75-5915. Conduct of election and ballot =_exception.
(1) The trustees of each district shall call a trustee
election on the regular school election day of each school
fiscal year under the provisions of section 75-6406, except
as provided in section 75-5914.1. The trustees shall call
and conduct the trustee election in the manner prescribed in
this litle for school elections. Any elector qualified to
vote under the provisions of section 75-6410 may vote at a
trustee election. The trustee election ballots shall be
substantially in the following form:

131 When additional trustees in a high school district are to be elected, a separate ballot shall be used in each nominating districi showing only the names of those candidates for which tite alectors of such district are entitled to vote.
