BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

9 Section 1. Section 11-1832, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to read as follows:

"11-1832. Minimum wage of police in first and second class cities. Each duly confirmed member of a police department of cities of the first and second class of the state of Montana is entitled to a minimum wage for a daily service of eight (8) hours' work, of at least seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750) minimum per month for the first year of service, and thereafter of at least seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750) minimum a month plus one-per-cent-(1%) 11/2% of the minimum base monthly salary of seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750) for each additional year of service up-to-and including-the-twentieth-year-of-additional-service."
