In compliance with a written request received January 25, 19 77, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for House Bill 440 pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 440 proposes to increase longevity pay for police by 1/2 percent per year and to eliminate the 20 year limit.

ASSUMPTIONS:

Total salary reported to P.E.R.S. for the fourteen 1st and 2nd class cities for FY 76 was \$4,653,720 which includes shift differential and longevity, as well as base salary.

Calculations based on membership in Statewide Police Reserve System as of June 30, 1976, of 434 members belonging to 1st and 2nd class cities.

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION
11-1832, R.C.M. 1947, TO INCREASE LONGEVITY PAY FOR POLICE
AND ELIMINATE THE 20-YEAR LIMIT."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 11-1832, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to
read as follows:

"11-1832. Minimum wage of police in first and second
class cities. Each duly confirmed member of a police
department of cities of the first and second class of the
state of Montana is entitled to a minimum wage for a daily
service of eight (8) hours' work, of at least seven hundred
fifty dollars (\$750) minimum per month for the first year of
service, and thereafter of at least seven hundred fifty
dollars (\$750) minimum a month plus ~~one-per-cent-(1%)~~ 1 1/2%
of the minimum base monthly salary of seven hundred fifty
dollars (\$750) for each additional year of service ~~up-to-and~~
~~including-the-twentieth-year-of-additional-service."~~
