## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Enactment of House Bill 450 will result in the creation of an Extension Forester in the Cooperative Extension Service and will appropriate funds for such a position.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

- A half-time secretary, office equipment, and operating expenses will be required in addition to the Extension Forester.
   The Extension Forester will conduct an educational program that includes forest ecology, forest inventory, and
- forest economics. He will be primarily concerned with providing information to small private forest landowners who need educational assistance. He will also work with professional foresters and users of products in establishing reasonable and good forest land management practices.
