Commission on growth in state governmental 21 21 22 expenditures. (1) As authorized by Article VI, section 7, of 22

expenditures. (1) As authorized by Article VI, section 7, of the Montana constitution, there is created a temporary commission to be known as the commission on growth in state governmental expenditures.

INTRODUCED BILL

(2) The commission shall be comprised of members appointed by the governor to serve at his pleasure and selected on the following basis: (a) a bipartisan delegation from the legislature composed of four members of the senate and four members of the house of representatives; (b) not more than two members to be chosen from outside of state government; and (c) additional persons from the executive branch of state government. (3) The governor shall appoint the chairman of the commission; the commission members may elect a vice-chairman, secretary, and other necessary officers from among their members. Section 2. Meetings. (1) The chairman shall schedule eight meetings of the commission. (2) Members of the commission are entitled to compensation of \$40 a day and to reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses while on commission business. Section 3. Study. The commission shall make a detailed study leading to draft legislation providing for a method of curtailing growth in state governmental expenditures. Section 4. Report. A written report with

24 recommendations regarding draft legislation shall be made 25 available to the governor and the members of the legislature

2 Section 5. Appropriation. There is appropriated

3 \$45,000 from the general fund to the commission for the

4 biennium ending June 30, 1979, for conducting the study and

5 preparing the report authorized by this act.

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
