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9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HONTANA:

Section 1. Definition. "Health care provider" means a

person, corporation, facility, or institution of a

governmental unit of the state or duly licensed by the state

to provide health care, including but not limited to:

- (1) physicians;
- 15 (2) osteopaths;
- 16 (3) registered nurses;
- 17 (4) licensed practical nurses;
- 18 (5) dentists;
- 19 (6) optometrists;
- 20 (7) podiatrists;
- 21 (8) chiropractors; or
- 22 (9) hospitals, hospital-related facilities, or
- 23 long-term care facilities, as defined in 69-5201.
- 24 Section 2. Standard of care for providing health care
- 25 services. A health care provider assumes toward the patient

the obligation to exercise the ordinary and reasonable care
that is usually exercised by health care providers of the
same profession in the same or a similar community in the
state.

Section 3. Limitation on use of expert testimony. No expert testimony on the standard of care is admissible as evidence except that given by a health care provider of the same profession who, at the time of the alleged negligence, was practicing in the same or a similar community in the state as that of the health care provider against whom the suit is filed.

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
